Warbirds Down Under

Bruce and Dianne, Neil and Jillian and Wayne and Sue went to Temora for the biennial Warbirds Down Under spectacular and we were amongst a crowd of around 12,000 aircraft enthusiasts who witnessed a fabulous, unrepeatable display.

The day promised to be hot and most were soon cooking in the low 30 degree temperatures - it was as hot as the flying displays were riveting, accurate and spectacular.

What was the highlight? There was something for everyone with historic jets, the RAAF Roulettes, Air Force trainers, the FA-18 hornet, a PBY Catalina and continuous action all day. Hearing that Hornet fire up its turbine for the take-off run was extraordinary.



My favourite was the arrival of the Lockheed Super Constellation that made a rather low key entrance to the field before some low level circuits and just, plain showing off its elegant lines and fabulous 16,000 hour restoration. So you think your fully restored V12 needs lots of cash? Well, consider Connie's numbers – how about:-


4 engines, each being 18 cylinders, twin row and supercharged of 55 litres capacity. In the cruise, expect a fuel burn of 455 litres per hour from each engine. It burns a lot of juice because each engine develops 3,400 HP!



The PBY Catalina was yet another interesting example of a beautiful restoration undertaken here in Australia. These flying boats topped out in cruise at only about 110 knots and were powered by 1,000 HP radials and carried a crew of 10, uncomfortably and slowly!

David Lowy is to be afforded maximum accolades for assembling one of the world's most unique flying collections and being able to present them in immaculate and accurate condition. We are lucky to have such a collection in Australia and to think that it is "just up the road" at Temora.


We have decided to stay a further 2 weeks in Ireland and travel to Belfast before heading to Paris for Christmas.
